2024 Uralla District Show Society President's Report.

Preparations are progressing well for the 2024 Uralla show (our 149th). The small but very dedicated Show Committee have been planning and organising for the full year and I think that the 2024 show will be very successful.

This year's show will be a combination of our traditional show and some perhaps some more modern ideas. We have decided this year to have more live music during the day with two very popular local performers. We will be entertained during the day by Tommy Miller and in the evening by Kevin Spencer both from Tamworth. We are also having motorcycle barrel racing and the very popular demolition derby, both noisy and very exciting.

Some of the other highlights this year will be "The Grand Parade" (with great prizes) and the "Uralla Fire Brigade's Rescue Demonstration".

For the children there will be the best decorated bike competition, the pet competition and the lolly chase. For the bigger kids (and older) there will be the motorcycle barrel racing, live music and of course the side shows.

Our Pavilion Committee has also been working very hard to present the wonderful produce, cooking, art, photography and handicraft that our area produces. There is also the schools section and the home brew competition. Also, there is the wool section with a wonderful display of many types of wool but particularly the superfine wool that the New England is famous for.

Our committee has also tried to keep the show family friendly. Our gate admission prices have not increased and many of the pavilion prizes have doubled but the entry fees are unchanged. Our show kitchen provides tasty food and drinks at very reasonable prices. They also can provide gluten free food as required.

Also, for the motoring enthusiast, there will be a display of vintage and specialist cars competing for the “Uralla Show and Shine”. There will also be a display of vintage machinery as you enter the main gate.

For those that love horses, our main ring will have events throughout the day with a very comprehensive program. If you like poultry there is a large display, I am not quite sure what a “Large Softfeather “is, but you will find it there.

I would like to thank our Honorary Secretary, Mrs Sue Barnden, for the massive amount of work and time that she puts in, not only at show time but during the whole year. Also, to the Uralla Bowling Club for their donation towards the fireworks which our children enjoy so much. A special thankyou also goes to Rotary and the Uralla Lions, the Uralla Showground Land Managers, the Uralla Shire Council and Local Fire Brigade. Thanks also to TJ’s (Foodworks) supermarket for your assistance. Thanks also to Bill, Carl, Marg, Rae, Noel, Gail, Jo, Liam, Tony & Debbie.

Thanking everybody for the assistance that they give to the Uralla Show would take a very long time. 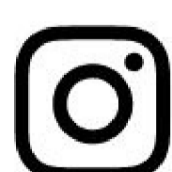

Your commitment is vital to the success of "Your Uralla Show" Thank you.

Uralla District Show Society Inc. Regulations

1. **Competitors' Tickets:** Each exhibit to be accompanied by a ticket to the value required as entry fee in its class. Tickets may be purchased daily at the Secretary's Office from Saturday, 27th January 2024 (see Office Hours on page 16) or at the Ring Office and Secretary's Office each day of the Show. NO REFUNDS given on tickets.
2. **Prizemoney:** Competitors may claim prizemoney on production of prize vouchers. Vouchers will be issued by Stewards at conclusion of judging. All monies MUST be collected at the Show unless prior arrangements have been made. Ring competitors may claim prizemoney at the Ring office. Prizemoney for stock and Pavilion Classes will be paid at the Show Office.
3. All stock to be bona fide property of the exhibitor for one month prior to the date of the Show and all produce or manufacture exhibited, except or otherwise stated, must be grown or made by the exhibitor.
4. Stock, produce, manufactured exhibits or works of arts not particularised in the Schedule, may be entered as non-competitive exhibits and, upon the recommendation of the judge, a certificate of merit will be granted to some if deemed worthy. It shall not be compulsory on the judge to award any prizes unless more than one, or where the exhibits do not possess sufficient merit to deserve a prize.
5. No exhibit or part-exhibit to be eligible to compete in more than one class section, except in the horse section. Special prizes, or where otherwise provided in the schedule. The stewards shall be empowered to reject any entry not complying with the conditions of the class.
6. Wherever the words "horse" or "horses" occur in the schedule, it shall be taken to include either sex. Stallions are not to compete in any section or class other than the one they are entered in as stallions (except sporting events).
7. No exhibit to be removed before 5pm on the first day of the Show, but must be returned by 9am on the subsequent days. All prize winning horses and led stock must take part in the parade under penalty of forfeiture (if parade held).
8. Competitors agree to abide by any decision of the Committee in regard to entries, and agree to compete/exhibit at their own risk and to indemnify and keep indemnified the society against all claims, suits, actions or demands which may be brought against it in respect of any injuries, loss, damage or misdelivery sustained in the course of competing in any event/s and/or class/es. They further agree to exonerate the Uralla District Show Society Incorporated, its member, Trustees and committee, and NSW Crown Lands from all responsibilities and from all loss or injury whether from alleged negligence or otherwise.
9. All protests to be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$55.00 They must be delivered to the Secretary's office not later than 30 minutes after the award has been made, but if good cause is shown for the delay, the committee may consider protests made at a later period. Should the protest be considered frivolous the \$55.00 shall be passed to the credit of the Society. If requested, the exhibitor must make a declaration to the bona fides of his exhibit.
10. Should any exhibit, to which a prize has been awarded, be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the prize. The committee to decide.
11. The decisions of the committee shall be final and binding in all cases.
12. Any person in the ring, if asked to retire, must do so or be removed.
13. The decision of the judges shall be final. Should any exhibitor refuse to accept the awards, he shall be expelled from the ground. Any exhibitor who insults the judge acting for the Society, or any official, during the holding of the Show, by word or action, may be expelled from the Society if a member, and may be disqualified from again competing at future Shows, for such time as the committee thinks fit. Every such disqualification shall be reported to all other Societies belonging to the Board of Appeal, and shall extend to all Shows held by these Societies, during the period for which the disqualification is imposed.
14. No sideshows shall be permitted on the ground unless approved by the committee.
15. All stock owners making entries of stock for which pens are required and not sending exhibits for same, shall be fined 50 cents for each exhibit so omitted, unless three days notice has been given.
16. Most successful exhibitor awards: points will not be awarded unless two or more exhibitors in the class.

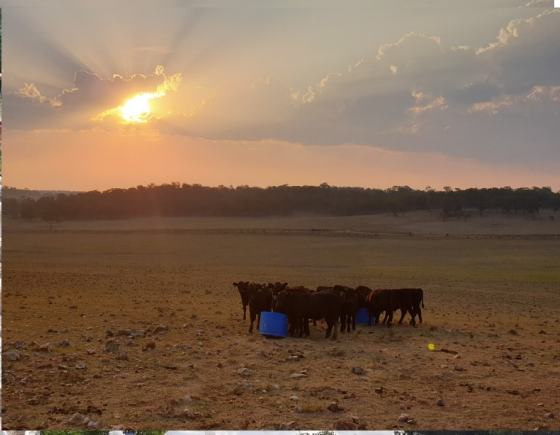
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
